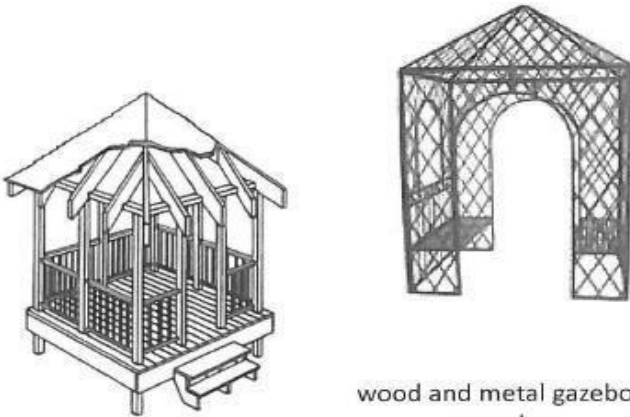
Brief Project Description _____

Required Documents

- Drawing showing the location, size, required setbacks, details of trim and materials.
 - Manufacturer's catalog information or picture of the gazebo.
 - Paint or finish colors.
- The architectural design is compatible with the architectural character and scale of the home and the community.
- The setback from the rear and side property lines is a minimum of five feet (5') and ten feet (10') from the home. Posts or supports will not be within the setback; however, the overhang may extend up to two feet (2') into the minimum setback.
- The overall height of the structure is no more than ten feet (10') above the adjacent grade.
- The gazebo will be level and installed on a stable solid surface.
- Gazebo may be redwood with natural stain, wood painted to match home's main body or trim color or metal in a bronze, black, brown, white, dark green, or almond color. Color selection must blend with house body or house trim colors.
- May require City of Lincoln Building Permit.
- The timeline for completion of work is within 90 calendar days from the start of work and must be completed before the one-year approved application period expires.
