Board of Directors Report

Clubs and Community Organizations Committee (CCOC)

s a newly elected member to the Board of Directors, I have been appointed by the Board President to be the Liaison to the Clubs and Community Organizations Committee, commonly referred to as the CCOC.


The CCOC, with the support of the Association administrative staff, provides assistance to the BOD in approving new club applications, club bylaws, club dissolutions, and attending to other matters to ensure the administration of a proper relationship between the Association and its approved clubs.

The committee consists of the Chair, Vice Chair, and five members. All members are recommended to the BOD for approval for a two-year term, but may serve an additional two-year term. The Chair may be re-appointed without term limits with the approval of the BOD.

The CCOC performs the following functions:

- Develops and recommends to the BOD policies and guidelines that will provide direction and structure for club bylaws;
- Provides information, direction, and structure for the development of club bylaws and the framework for their operational practices and governance;
- Provides a fill-in-the-blank template for a club to use to facilitate creating or revising their bylaws;
- Maintains club information and provides

a Guideline Handbook of Association policies and practices;



• Determines if a new club has a minimum of 20 members.

After reviewing new or revised club bylaws, the CCOC:

- 1) Accepts the bylaws and recommends approval to the BOD; or
- 2) Accepts the bylaws subject to required changes;
- 3) Does not accept the bylaws. (However, the Club may appeal the CCOC decision directly to the BOD.)








> re you looking forward to celebrating the holidays with cheerful decorations and colorful lights?



Holiday decorations are one of the highlights of the season and it's a perfect time to express your creative talent. So, feel free to break out your Thanksgiving, Hanukkah and Christmas decorations. There's no need to apply for

approval.

The Winter Holiday season begins November 15 and ends January 15, while displays for other major holidays may begin two weeks before and should be taken down no later than two weeks after. So let your talent shine and join in the celebration.

Santa and Other Visitors

Another pleasure of the holiday season is having your family and friends stay for a visit. Did you know that according to the rules, your guests may stay with you for up to 60 days in a calendar year? Your guests are welcome to use the common areas and facilities with you, although there may be some restrictions for certain events or activities. If you don't plan to accompany your guest, you may purchase Guest Passes at the Membership and Activities Desks or at the Fitness Centers.

Children are also welcome to use the common areas and facilities with you, but certain times and activities may be reserved for adult use. And be sure the children are supervised at all times either by you or an adult guest with a Guest Pass.

No Parking on the Roof

Along with holiday guests and activities comes the problem of where your guests may park overnight. RV rigs may be parked on the street for a total of five nights in a calendar month, but for no more than two consecutive nights at a time. And for other vehicles, if there's no room in your driveway, you might ask a neighbor if they would let your guest park in their driveway overnight.

You know Santa is making a list and checking it twice. So, to make sure you and your guests have an enjoyable time and can use the facilities to their fullest, please make sure that everyone's behavior will get their name on the "Nice" list. Have a Happy Holiday!

What are the reasons for having a reserve account?

efore answering your questions regarding the reserve account, I would like to introduce myself as your new Finance Committee Chair and also thank Mike Creasy for his years of committee service. Mike resigned last month in order to concentrate on personal goals. He has served our community well for over four years. During his tenure as chair, along with other projects, Mike instituted several new and innovative ways of presenting each month's budget results to the community.

As I was growing up, I watched my parents put money aside for the inevitable rainy day. And sure enough, those days came. Instead of taking money out of the current month's budget, Mom would put her hand in the cookie jar and take out what was needed. When our house got to be 15 years old, she dipped her hand in more often. The house experienced more wear and tear. While some replacements

were less expensive, others were more as technology changed. As we added a color television or replaced the refrigerator for a new and better one, more money was added to the cookie jar to accommodate

as furniture in the Lodges or as complicated as an air conditioning and heating system. Without a reserve account, each homeowner would be assessed each time something needed repair or replacement.

The Browning Reserve Group, who conducts our reserve study, reports that we should have 78% of our reserves funded since not everything depreciates to its end or gets repaired or replaced each year. Newly purchased items such as the pickleball lighting or the pool heating system will be added to the reserve requirements list.

September and October financial reports will be discussed at the November meeting which is slated for November 18 at 8:30 AM in the Solarium (OC). I hope you will join me and the committee.




A Time for Helping The Joy of Giving

The Host Lions Club has food donation boxes in the lobby area of both Orchard Creek and Kilaga Springs Lodges. Items placed in these boxes, which are collected regularly, will fill approximately 500 Holiday boxes. Collection boxes will be in our Lodges until December 8. Local Toys For Tots items to match the number, gender, and ages of children in selected families are combined with food boxes for distribution by the Lions volunteers.

You may purchase these succulent sweets for yourself, as gifts for others, or for the "See's for Soldiers" program. Kiwanis supports many programs for local children.





Once you leave the feral tract, turn right on Stoneridge to Fountain Hill. A sidewalk path completes the trail loop.

Directions: From OC, right on Del Webb, left on Stoneridge, take the fourth right (Fountain Hill Loop) and turn left at the end of the street parking at the court. The walk is a loop of approximately 25 minutes. See your Community Directory and Resource Guide Street Name Index Foldout Map 1.



Some Wheel Tips For

Trouble Free Cycling.

- Carry patch kit, tools, and spare tube.
- When remounting a wheel, if pushing on the quick release lever leaves an imprint on your palm, then it is tight.
- Once a week inspect each tire for embedded debris.
- Before installing a new tube, check inside the tire for the cause of your flat.
- If a spoke breaks, stop, remove it or twist it around the next spoke. A loose spoke could damage your derailleur.
- If you hear clicking sounds, put a drop of oil on each spoke crossing. Spokes rubbing together may cause the noise.
- Put your patch kit and tools in an old sock. Everything is organized. When you need to make a repair, slip the sock over your hand to avoid getting greasy.
- Maintain proper tire pressure (shown on the tire wall).
